As we approach the latter part of the year, I am excited to inform our community newsletter readers of recent and upcoming events within our community: Dying to Know Day on the 8th of August and the Toowoomba Death Expo: Demystifying Death and Dying which will be held on the 11th of October on International Hospice and Palliative Care Day. These events are aimed at fostering open, respectful conversations about death and dying, a topic that is often difficult to approach but essential for both individuals and families.

Dying to Know Day is an annual campaign in Australia held on the 8th of August, focused on encouraging open and honest conversations about death, dying, and End-of-Life planning. It aims to normalise discussions about mortality, destigmatise End-of-Life planning, and empower individuals to make their wishes known. The theme for 2025 was, "Nobody Knows," highlighting the potential chaos and conflict that can arise when people's final wishes are not known or shared. To celebrate this day, the Hospice participated on the panel on ABC radio with Author Lisa Herbert and Dr Etleva Harijav. We highlighted the importance of having these open discussions with loved ones, and to gain a better understanding of how to prepare for the inevitable with dignity and peace.

The Hospice continues to participate in these community engagement conversations and promote the free service provided by Toowoomba Hospice. The Hospice's ongoing commitment to provide person centred care that extends beyond the physical to the emotional, social, and psychological needs of both our patients and their families. **These Conversations Matter** as death is an unavoidable part of life, yet it is often a subject that is avoided or feared. At Toowoomba Hospice, we believe that talking about death openly can alleviate some of that fear. It allows people to express their wishes, prepare for the future, and ultimately find peace in their final days.

We encourage all members of the community to join us at the Toowoomba Death Expo. Whether you are caring for someone with a terminal illness, dealing with your own mortality, or simply seeking a better understanding of palliative care, the process of dying, this event will provide invaluable information and a sense of connection in what can otherwise be an isolating experience.



Death Expo: Breaking the Silence Around End-of-Life Matters

Conversation

The Death Expo is a unique opportunity for the Toowoomba community to come together and explore various aspects of death, grief, and End-of-Life care. As a hospice, we understand that the end of life is a deeply personal experience, and many people find it difficult to navigate the complexities of advanced care planning, grief support, and the emotional challenges that accompany this time. This event is designed to break the silence surrounding death, offering visitors an opportunity to engage with experts, learn about services available, and ask questions in a safe, supportive environment.

At the Death Expo, attendees will have the chance to speak with palliative care professionals about comfort and care options, learn about advance care planning and legal considerations, explore grief support resources for individuals and families, discover funeral planning and pre-arrangement services, and participate in workshops aimed at reducing anxiety surrounding the dying process.

By addressing these topics, the organisers of the Death Expo hope to normalise conversations about dying and empower individuals to make informed decisions for themselves and their loved ones.




Together with the community,
